
Drs. Boes and Cabrera selected as committee members for the upcoming ASES National Shoulder and Elbow Week Dallas Event




Longitudinal Improvement of Quality of Life in Children with Legg-Calve-Perthes Disease treated with Proximal Femoral Varus Osteotomy

PGY 2 resident, **Angel Valencia**, **M.D.**, and PGY-4 resident, **Dang-Huy Do**, **M.D.**, collaborated with UT Southwestern Orthopaedic Surgery and Scottish Rite Faculty, **Chan-Hee Jo**, **Ph.D.**, and **Harry Kim**, **M.D.**, on this study published in the **Journal of Pediatric Orthopaedics** two weeks ago.

Proximal femoral varus osteotomy is commonly performed to improve femoral head containment and decrease deformity in Legg-Calve-Perthes Disease. The purpose of this study is to determine the longitudinal changes to patient-reported physical, mental, and social health measures after PFVO. Click here to read more of the study.

Acetabular rim syndrome revisited

While it is generally accepted that most patients undergoing joint replacement do not require a cardiac stress test, individuals with existing or potential cardiac conditions may be at an increased risk of perioperative complications following primary total knee arthroplasty (TKA).
