




At UTSW, an innovative procedure offers new hope for amputees




Research grants awarded to two UT Southwestern Orthopaedic Surgery and Scottish Rite Faculty

From Dr. Hernandez leading the Open Door outreach program to Dr. Kim speaking at the





Prevalence of Asymptomatic Acetabular Labrum Abnormalities in the Active Pediatric Population

The prevalence of labral tears in asymptomatic active adults has been reported, but the prevalence of labral tears and other incidental hip lesions in the asymptomatic active pediatric population remains unclear. The purpose of this study was to determine the prevalence of hip abnormalities detected on 3T MRI in an active pediatric population with no hip symptoms and to compare with hip abnormalities found in children and adolescents who underwent an MRI for a hip-related condition.

Factors predicting manipulation under anesthesia after total knee replacement

Manipulation under anesthesia (MUA) is a standard and effective treatment to correct stiffness and improve range of motion (ROM) following total knee arthroplasty (TKA). Delayed MUA has been associated with increased rates of revision surgeries and infections. Early MUA has been shown to double the mean gain in flexion compared to delayed interventions.


