


New Residency Program Directors for UT Southwestern Orthopaedic Surgery


Top Research:

Low-Cost Lower Extremity Screening to Predict Shoulder Distraction Force in College Softball Pitchers

UT Southwestern Orthopaedic Surgery Assistant Professor, **Sophia Ulman, Ph.D.**, also a faculty member at Scottish Rite for Children, was among the authors who worked on this one-of-a-kind collaborative study featured in the March issue of *The American Journal of Sports Medicine.*


The purpose of this study is to predict shoulder distraction force using low-cost, in-clinic screening measures, including isometric hip rotation strength and trunk mechanics during a single leg squat. <u>Click here</u> to read the full study.





The Midline Lateral Parapatellar Arthrotomy: A Safe Alternative Approach for Lateral Tibial Plateau Fractures

The midline lateral parapatellar (LP) approach has been shown in a cadaveric study to provide superior articular exposure compared with the anterolateral approach (AL). The study reports on outcomes and complications with the LP approach.



Longitudinal Improvement of Quality of Life in Children With Legg-Calve-Perthes Disease Treated With Proximal Femoral Varus Osteotomy

Proximal femoral varus osteotomy (PFVO) is commonly performed to improve femoral head containment and decrease deformity in Legg-Calve-Perthes disease (LCPD). Little is known about how PFVO impacts the quality of life after surgery. The purpose of this study is to determine the longitudinal changes to patient-reported physical, mental, and social health measures after PFVO.
