During the academic year, UT Southwestern Medical Center earned their recertification from **The Joint Commission** as a leading **Hip Fracture Center.**



Dr. Kim awarded CTSA Pilot Grant for Hip Dysplasia research


We're proud to share that **Harry Kim, M.D., M.S.**, has been awarded a **CTSA Pilot Grant** as a co-principal investigator for a pioneering Al project that uses canine and human radiographs to improve the diagnosis of hip dysplasia in children.

This interdisciplinary study leverages a dataset of more than 900,000 canine hip radiographs to train AI models for automated diagnosis—then applies those insights to human hip dysplasia cases through translational transfer learning. It represents an important step toward enhancing diagnostic accuracy and accessibility in both veterinary and pediatric orthopedic care.

By translating findings from a natural model of hip dysplasia in dogs to human pediatric care, Dr. Kim, alongside the principal investigator and collaborator, **Dr. Candice Chu**, is advancing the field toward earlier and more accurate hip dysplasia diagnosis through artificial intelligence.




