Dr. McIntosh awarded the SRS Hibbs Award for study on early-onset scoliosis surgery

Congratulations to UT Southwestern Orthopaedic Surgery Professor and Scottish Rite faculty, Amy McIntosh, M.D., as well as Karina Zapata, Ph.D., and Charlie Johnston, M.D. for winning the SRS Hibbs Award for Best Clinical Research Paper at this year's SRS Annual Meeting.

Their study, "Wait to Operate: Surgery Demonstrated No Pulmonary Benefit Compared

to Non-Operative Treatment in EOS Patients", analyzed nearly two decades of data and found that pulmonary function declined at similar rates in both surgical and non-operative groups challenging long-held assumptions about earlyonset scoliosis surgery.

This work is shaping the future of pediatric spine care and underscores the need for continued research to guide evidence-based treatment for children with complex conditions.

Lyda Hill Philanthropies Awards Scottish Rite for Children \$1 Million to Study ACL Injury Prevention in Young Female Athletes



Movement science researchers at Scottish Rite for Children have received a \$1 million grant from Lyda Hill Philanthropies to fund, in part, two projects addressing the concerning rise of ACL injuries in young female athletes. According to studies published in **The American Journal of Sports Medicine**, adolescent female athletes are at the highest risk of suffering an anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) injury: 29 times more likely than adult women and eight times more likely than their adolescent male counterparts.



This analysis demonstrates a change in practice trends after publication of the 2013 AAOS CPG. Both overall and age cohort-specific arthroscopic utilization rates consistently decreased year over year for all cohorts in accordance with the publication of the 2013 AAOS CPG.


