### Dr. Cabrera named as new team doctor for Dallas Trinity FC


**Alison Cabrera, M.D.** has been tapped as the new orthopaedic surgery and sports medicine team doctor for **Dallas Trinity FC**.

health, and people are snapping them up. The research, however, is mixed on whether supplements actually help with stiffness and pain. **Antonia Chen**, chair of orthopaedic surgery at UT Southwestern Medical Center, warns patients that these supplements aren't well studied or tightly regulated by the federal government.

Children living in neighborhoods with fewer educational and social/economic opportunities were associated with longer times from injury to orthopaedic evaluation and from injury to MRI for shoulder instability and were at a higher risk for recurrent shoulder dislocations.





## Extensor Tendon Centralization of the Metacarpophalangeal Joint Using a Synthetic Suture Tape


This new study, featuring UT Southwestern Orthopaedic Surgery Assistant Professor, **Daniel Koehler, M.D.**, and PGY 5 resident, **Dang-Huy Do, M.D.** as co-authors, introduces a new technique using synthetic suture tape to create a pulley over the MCP joint, centralizing the EDC tendon without relying on native tissue quality or autografts.
